The symbol in the bracket of the last bullet point has been corrected to read (\leq 0.01%).

Hyoscine hydrobromide

Page 17 (header at the top of the page)

Changed from propantheline to hyoscine hydrobromide.

Phenobarbital

Page 272 (Dose and use; Terminal agitation)

5th bullet point, the word 'gamma;' has been removed.

Oxycodone

Page 426 (Box 5.V; Dose recommendations)

A missing bullet point symbol has been inserted, and units inserted into the last bullet point so that it reads 40mg/20mg.

Opioid antagonists
