

## Lidocaine 5% medicated plasters – What is your experience?

1) Have you prescribed or advised the use of lidocaine 5% medicated plasters in palliative care? (one\_of)

2) In what circumstances have you prescribed or advised the use of lidocaine 5% medicated plasters? (freetext)

Generally members reported that they used lidocaine plasters for neuropathic pain in relation to many diagnoses, but particularly chest wall pain from mesothelioma, spinal pain or bone metastasis. A few reported use in allodynia and post-herpetic pain.

3) Generally, how many lidocaine 5% medicated plasters do you need to use on a patient at one time? (one\_of)

8) Please add any further comments (good or bad) on your experience with lidocaine 5% medicated plasters. (freetext)

There were only a few comments. On the positive side, members reported that the plasters seem generally well tolerated, and may be useful in some patients. On the negative side they reported the significant cost and that adherence of the plasters can be a problem. Some members stated that they are unconvinced of the benefit, and that perhaps a protective covering of the painful site would be as effective.
