## **EMERGENCY DRUGS DOSAGE SUGGESTIONS**

## GENERAL PRINCIPLES

- 1. All doses are suggestions only and to be decided finally by prescribing Doctor in light of patient characteristics.
- 2. Always attempt to treat remediable causes for any symptom.
- 3. If setting up a syringe driver, remember that loading / stat subcutaneous doses of drugs are often necessary to initiate treatment.
- 4. Diamorphine doses are  $^{1}/_{3}$  of total oral morphine dose eg 60mg Morphine / 24 hrs = 20mg Diamorphine / 24 hrs.
- 5. Rescue or loading doses of Diamorphine are <sup>1</sup>/<sub>6</sub> of total 24 hr <u>Diamorphine</u> requirement.
- 6. Try to limit number of drugs in the driver to minimum to avoid compatibility problems.
- 7. Always check for previous drug reactions or idiosyncrasies.
- 8. It is a good practice to reassess the situation after a few hours.
- 9. Some of the drug indications overleaf whilst currently accepted palliative care practice are "off licence" treatments.
