To Whom It May Concern:

PERSONS TRAVELLING TO OR FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM CARRYING CONTROLLED DRUGS

Thank you for your recent enquiry and/or application for a Home Office licence to carry controlled drugs.

We would like to draw your attention to substantial changes surrounding requirements for such licences. These changes will take effect from 1 January 2007.

As of this date any person travelling for any period up to and including 28 days, i.e. 4 weeks, will not require a Home Office licence regardless of the drug and amount being carried.

However, it is important that our advice concerning the carriage of a letter issued by the prescribing doctor or drug worker is still followed. The letter should contain the following information:

- Your name
- Your address
- Your date of birth
- The outward and return dates of your travel
- The country you are visiting
- List the drugs you are carrying, including dosages and total amounts

Additionally, it is always advisable to contact the Embassy/Consulate/High Commission of the country to be visited to ensure you will not be refused entry with the drug(s) you wish to carry.
