### SELF-ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION BY PATIENTS POLICY

PURPOSE	The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines for the self- administration of medications by non-staff members (e.g. patients, family members)		
POLICY STATEMENT	<ul> <li>Self-administration of medications by inpatients is not encouraged. When medications are to be self-administered the following are required:</li> <li>A. For administration of medications by non-staff members (eg.patients, family members) the individual(s) must be deemed competent for self-administration prior to the physician or authorized prescriber ordering the medication.</li> <li>B. Specific medication order(s) are written by the physician or authorized prescriber, for self-administration by the patient or caregiver, including the medication, dose, frequency, route, indication, and whether the medication is to be stored at bedside.</li> <li>C. If kept at bedside, the medication shall be labeled as "Bedside Medication" by the Pharmacy. When additional medication is needed the nurse shall notify the pharmacy.</li> <li>D. Patient education for the patient or caregiver (non-staff member) shall include information on the medication, dose, frequency, route, indication, and expected actions or side effects.</li> <li>E. Documentation of patient education for self-administration by non-staff members shall be be made in the patient medical record.</li> <li>F. Documentation of administration of medications by non-staff members shall be made in the patient medical record.</li> </ul>

# SELF-ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION BY PATIENTS PROCEDURE

General requirements	1.	Self-administration of medications by non-staff members (e.g. patients, family members) is not encouraged. Specific written orders are required for self-administration.			
Non-Staff member competency	2.	The physician or other authorized prescriber, prior to ordering medications for administration by non-staff members (e.g. patient, family members), shall assess the competency of the individual (through discussion, review of patient condition, etc.) for medication self-administration.			
Order requirements	3.	<ul> <li>Orders require the following:</li> <li>Specific medication orders shall be written by the physician or authorized prescriber for self-administration by the patient or caregiver.</li> <li>Such medication order(s) shall also include the medication, dose, frequency, route, indication, and whether the medication is to be stored at the bedside.</li> <li>If kept at bedside, the medication shall be labeled as "Bedside Medication" by the Pharmacy. Otherwise, the medication will be kept in the nursing unit's medication cart.</li> </ul>			
Use of patient's own medications	4.	If the medication to be self-administered is the patient's own medication, the requirements for the policy on <i>Medication Brought into the Hospital by the Patient Policy</i> must also be met.			
Supply of Medication	5.	When additional medication is needed for bedside use and self-administration, the nurse shall notify the Pharmacy.			
Patient Education	6.	<ul> <li>Patient education must be completed before the individual is allowed to self-administer the medication.</li> <li>Patient education for the patient or caregiver (non-staff member) shall be reviewed with the patient by the physician or other authorized prescriber, nurse, or appropriate healthcare provider within their scope of practice.</li> <li>Patient education will include information on the medication, indication for use, how to take the medication</li> </ul>			

(dose, frequency, route), and expected actions or side effects.

• Documentation of patient education shall be made in the patient medical record according to institutional policy.

# Documentation of Administration

7. The nursing personnel responsible for medication administration shall record each self-administered dose by the patient/caregiver in the patient medical record on the Medication Administration Report/Record (MAR).
